'Most improved team, from Day 1'

"This is truly a special event. Each one is a constant reminder of how big a deal this is — and credit goes to everyone in this room," said Coach Chad Johnston (right).
"This has been the most improved team, from Day 1," said Activities Director and Offensive Coordinator Matt Myrvik.

This state championship, while the talent was there, was not a given when the season started.

At the Welcome Home Saturday night, a jam-packed, standing only crowd heard Coach Johnston say, "When we went into the year, we had a lot of pieces in place — but our biggest unknown was the offensive line. We lost four linemen to graduation and they are such a big part of the game."

He added, "But this group stepped up every week and they got better and better." The coach said, "They became an even better team than I thought they would be." He said two words stood out about this team. They are: "Execution — and physicality."

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Grinding out a state championship

•Isaac Hennen rushes 34 times for 294 yards, three touchdowns and a two-point conversion.

Wabasso, fresh off a state tournament appearance last year, and ranked No. 1 in Class A, took their bid to win their second straight game over Minnesota into the Class A State Finals Saturday morning.

The Rabbits, the only team to beat Minnesota in the last 50 games, finally got its chance for a first state championship.

However, Minnesota, a six-time winner, hoped to avenge the loss to Wabasso in the Section 5A semi-finals a year ago.

In the end — it was Minnesota who came away with the state championship, 28-13 behind 294 yards rushing from Isaac Hennen on 34 carries.

"Wabasso is a very good football team," said Minnesota Coach Chad Johnston. "But we did an excellent job. This team surpassed the level we set for them."

After it was over, Wabasso Coach Joe Kemp agreed. "We expected this kind of thing out of Minnesota. They come at you hard in the box (on the line) and they come at you hard all the way down field," said Coach Kemp.

The two teams battled for an entire first quarter, but all that proved was the two teams were equal. By half-time, it was all knotted up at 7-7.

A big break gave Wabasso the first touchdown of the game and a 7-0 first quarter lead.

Alex Pohlen's punt from near the end zone was blocked by Nick Altermatt and Isaac Schmiesing picked it up and got to the two yard line.

From the one yard line, Cooper Taylor ran it in for Wabasso's first score and Colton Taylor kicked the extra point for a 7-0 Wabasso lead at 1:26 of the first half.

"We practiced that play all week," said Wabasso quarterback Altermatt.

And it paid off. But the Vikings first drive stalled and Pohlen came out of a passing formation to run nine yards for a fourth and one at the Wabasso 42 yard line.

Isaac Hennen went 12 yards to the Wabasso 30 to keep the drive alive.

Coach Johnston agreed, saying, "Wabasso was keeping our pass receivers covered and Alex (Pohlen) had to do a lot of scrambling."

The Rabbits got a second chance to score when Cooper Taylor got loose for a 40-yard run after breaking off left tackle.

Only a touchdown-saving tackle by Isaac Hennen kept him from going all the way.

The Rabbits had a third and three at the nine. Nick

Altermatt and Isaac Schmiesing picked it up and got to the two yard line.

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Ethan Krier saved perhaps his best game for last, collecting seven tackles. One of them was stopping the Rabbits' Cooper Taylor. Photo for The Mascot by Brian Jeremiason.

Hennen shed a tackle at the line and ran 21 yards to the Wabasso 10 for a first and goal.

While Pohlen was flushed out of the pocket, had to throw a "wounded duck" pass that was picked off by Wabasso's Jacob Plaezt to successfully stop the Minnesota drive.

"I didn't have a good first half passing. But they were putting a lot of pressure on us," said Minnesota quarterback Alex Pohlen.

Altermatt tried to smash up the middle, but was stopped by Cole Sanow for a fourth and four at the Viking 10.

That's when the Minnesota defensive line reared it's ugly head. Ethan Krier rose up and stopped Cooper Taylor, with help from Shawn Buysse and Minnesota had it's biggest stop of the day.

Earlier in the first quarter, Minnesota's defense stiffened with Ethan Krier and Shawn Buysse combin-

ing on one tackle and Krier getting another. The duo would prove invaluable in squashing Wabasso's second attempt to score.

"It was the game plan, we just executed the game plan," said lineman Mitchell Rost.

Krier added, "After awhile, they were getting slower and we feel like we out-smarted them and it got a lot easier to push them around."

The best Viking drive of the day started at their own

11 yard line. The Vikings went back to work in the offensive line.

Good blocking on the right side by Krier and Rost freed Isaac Hennen for a sweep and he moved the ball to the Minnesota 45. Hennen had all the yards in the extended drive.

Led by Isaac Schmiesing, the Rabbits made one stop on a third and five at the 50. But Hennen blasted up the middle behind the blocking of Ty Lipinski for

the lineup.

"We tried to move a few people around," said Coach Kemp. Did it change the game for Wabasso? "It did change something, it hurt," said the Rabbit coach.

After the Viking touchdown, the Rabbits used a long drive keyed by the running of Colton Taylor to get to the Viking 24.

An illegal procedure call set the Rabbits back five yards and Shawn Buysse put the pressure on Wabasso's quarterback Altermatt and he committed an intentional grounding that cost the Rabbits yards and a down.

It was second and 16 at the 34 and Minnesota held on a short pass with Cole Sanow shutting down the play. On a fourth and 24 on the Viking 34, the Rabbits punted out-of-bounds and Minnesota took over on its own 18.

The Vikings had held on an important drive after the Viking touchdown.

Key injury

But the Rabbits got another chance when they stopped the Vikings to force a punt.

A 43-yard punt turned out to be disastrous when Colton Taylor took the ball 13 yards and Logan Sussner was called for a face mask as he took Taylor down out of bounds. The Vikings also suffered a severe blow when Isaac Hennen went down and didn't get back up.

He finally rose and walked off the field with help from his coaching staff.

While he was out for a stretch, "Catching my wind because I was blind-sided," said Hennen, he knew he was coming back into the game.

The quarter ended and it was 13-7, Minnesota. Wabasso got the ball on the Viking 29 yard line. Tony Franta caught a 20-yard pass from Altermatt to set the ball up the Minnesota five yard line.

Then Kyle Jacobson smashed over from the one yard line to tie the game, 13-13. Altermatt's kick went wide left and with 11:23 left in the game, it was tied, 13-13.

"And we were right there," said Wabasso Coach Joe Kemp. Despite losing his running back Cooper Taylor, he felt, "This is where we want to be. This gives us a shot."

He's back

But Coach Kemp's exuberance took a hit when Isaac Hennen came back onto the field.

Two plays later Hennen's presence was felt. A Pohlen pass to Skylar Gilbertson got a first down at the Viking 46.

Then Hennen blasted through left tackle, was suddenly all alone and dashed 54-yards for a touchdown. Minnesota was up once again, 19-13 at 9:49 of the fourth quarter.

The Vikings went for a two-point conversion and Hennen rammed the ball over for a 21-13 lead.

Hennen went over 200 yards for the game with his carries after returning from the injury.

The Vikings got a huge stop from Mitchell Rost and Wabasso quarterback Nick Altermatt tried to go to the air. His pass was intercepted by Cole Sanow at the Wabasso 34 and the Vikings were in control.

Minnesota drove the ball down field to the 15 with 2:27 to go and Hennen scored again on a 15-yard blast up the middle for a 27-13 lead to put icing on the cake and preserve a state championship.

Pohlen kicked the extra point and Minnesota led 28-13. Late in the game, Cole VanOverbeke got a sack to add to his earlier fumble recovery as time began to run out on the Rabbits.

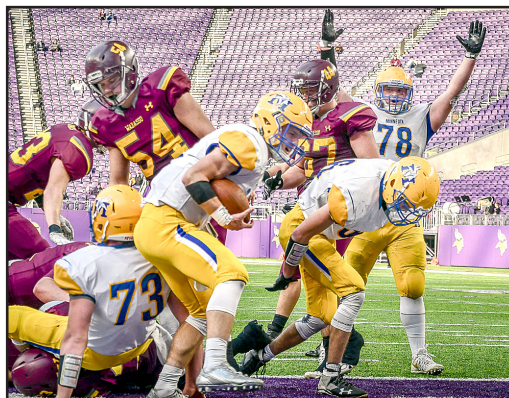
In the end, Hennen had 34 carries for 294 yards, three touchdowns and a two-point conversion.

Minneota won the state championship, 28-13, avenging a loss to Wabasso in Section 5A's semifinals last year. The Vikings are 50-1 in the past four seasons, with three championships in those four years.
